#### **Connection Before Correction**

Dr Daniel Siegel, a renowned psychiatrist and author who specializes in child development and neuroscience, has popularized the phrase "Connection before Correction." The rationale behind this phrase is that is imperative to have a strong connection with children BEFORE we try to correct or teach. Parents can do this by kneeling to their child's level and validating their feelings before offering gentle, yet firm, guidance or boundaries.

That could sound like, "I can see that you really want to play with that toy, it's really fun! And, we have to ask first. Let's try again." Or, "Oh, pal (Big Hug). I see toys that need to be put away. Do you need help or can you handle it alone?". Or, "I hear that you would like ice cream before dinner, I love you, and the answer is no." Or, "I see you are frustrated, would you like a hug?"

Loving questions may help to generate child driven solutions to navigate the myriad of developing emotions young children experience.

Author L.R. Knost's quote, "When little people are overwhelmed by big emotions, it's our job to share our calm, not join their chaos.", is a helpful reminder to calmly connect with children as we nurture their social- emotional development.

#### Please refrain from cell phone use at Playgroups

Children learn things like social cues, how to regulate emotions, and how to have conversations by watching and copying their parents. When children feel ignored, they often act out to get their parent's attention.

Psychologist Catherine Steiner-Adair, in her book, *The Big Disconnect: Protecting Childhood and Family Relationships in the Digital Age*, writes that parents who ignore their children in favor of devices are telling them *"they don't matter, that they're children are not interesting to them, they're not as compelling as anybody, anything, any ping that may interrupt their time with them."* 

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"Useful strategies to foster more intentionality in our cell phone practices are":

- Limit your use of your cell phone and devices to just 10 percent during the time you are with your child. You can dash off a quick text if it is important, but for the most part put the phone away
- Keep bedrooms, mealtimes, and parent-child play times screen free for children and parents.
- Use phone apps to remind you when it's time to stop using the phone.
- Turn off the majority of your notifications.
- Delete or limit your social media apps.
- Stop using your phone as an alarm clock because it's too easy to get caught up in checking for updates from friends, scanning texts, and reading emails if you pick up the phone to turn off the alarm.

#### The Hidden Benefits of Hide & Seek

"Have you ever thought about the hidden benefits of playing hide and seek? This timeless game cultivates problem-solving, critical thinking and creativity as children strategically select hiding spots and exercise impulse control to evade detection. Additionally, it nurtures quick decision-making and resourcefulness, teaching children to think and act swiftly when faced with pressure.

Beyond its cognitive advantages, hide and seek enriches social skills and emotional growth. John Spears, in an article on The Adventurous Child, states, "The game of hide and seek helps children to develop empathy and understanding of others. It fosters friendship and promotes positive social interactions between players. Through engaging in this game, children learn the importance of being respectful, patient, and considerate towards others."

Moreover, hide and seek provides physical exercise and sensory experiences crucial for a child's healthy development. In an era dominated by screens and digital engagement, the act of running, hiding, and engaging with the environment offers unique sensory play encounters that contribute to overall well-being."


